Be It Resolved by the Town Boards of the towns of Spring Prairie, Walworth county Wisconsin and of Burlington, Racine county Wisconsin, that the following changes be made in the territory of the Bell School District, Being Dist. No. 7, of the Town of Spring Prairie, and of District No. 3 of the town of Burlington, to-wit:

The Bell school district shall retain as its territory the west half ( $W\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the southwest quarter ( $SW\frac{1}{4}$ ) of section twenty (20), township three (3) north, range nineteen (19) east; and all that part of the northwest quarter ( $NW\frac{1}{4}$ ) of said section twenty (20), west of the highway.

The School District No. 3 shall include all of the rest, residue and remainder of said section twenty (20) not hereinabove assigned to the said Bell School District.

All other property and territory heretofore assigned to said school districts shall remain in said respective districts.

This resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and adoption by the town boards of Spring Prairie and Burlington.

On no further business Board of Audit Adjourned

At the annual town meeting of the Town of Burlington, Racine County, Wisconsin, held in the Town hall, April 1, 1941, the polls of election were opened at 9 o'clock in the forenoon.

Phillip Brandes, Frank David and Emil Rubach were the inspectors of election. Brother Francis and Mrs. Lawrence Albrecht were the clerks of election and Mrs. Geo. Frey and Mrs. Francis Weis were ballot clerks.

At one o'clock in the afternoon voting was suspended and the town meeting was held. Chairman Wm. Robers called the meeting to order and the annual report was read by the clerk. On motion by Alex Baumeister the report was adopted as read.

A motion was made by A. C. Muegler, that it is the wish of all taxpayers that the town board put forth every effort to have County trunk JJ extend as a county trunk from HY 43 down to Sobbe's corner, then west to Siehoff's corner and connect with the Kenosha County trunk in the town of Wheatland. This matter is to be taken up with the Kenosha County Board,

On motion by Mrs. Loegsteman and seconded by W. J. Legget it was decided to increase the assessor's salary from \$425.00 to 500.00 per year, an increase of \$75.00.

On motion by Arthur Kortendick and seconded by Mrs. Marion Thompson it was decided to increase the clerk from \$475.00 to \$550.00 and the treasurer from \$300.00 to \$375.00 an increase of \$75.00 each per year.

On motion by A. C. Muegler and seconded by Mrs. Oesteman it was decided to instruct the incoming town board to petition a second hearing from the Wisconsin Tax Commission in the matter of the Crippled Childrens' Camp tax exemption.

On no further business the meeting adjourned.

Voting again took place until five-thirty o'clock at which time the polls of election closed and the votes canvassed with the following result:

The total number of votes cast was 424.

The whole number of votes given for Chairman of Supervisors was 395, of which Wm. Robers received 252 and Henry Richter received 143. The whole number of votes given for Supervisors was 689, of which Bernard Ahler received 193, Alex Baumeister received 117, Edward Warren received 157 and Wm. Weis received 222. The whole number of votes given for Town Clerk was 417, of which Frank McManus received 191 and Otto Yahnke received 226. The whole number of votes given for Town Treasurer was 403 of which number George Bieneman received 106 and Clarence Kornhoff received 297. The whole number of votes given for Assessor was 357 of which Frank Bauman received 357. The whole number of votes given for Justices of the Peace was 326, of which number Wm. Becker received 324, and A. C. Muegler and Russell Cooney each received one. The whole



number of votes given for Constable was 620, of which number John Leickem received 97, James Pennfeather received 228 and Vern Robers received 295.
